### **RULES & REGULATIONS FOR ADMISSION**

- 1) The right of admission to any class is reserved by the Principal of the College.
- 2) A student seeking admission to this College shall present himself / herself alongwith his / her parents / guardians with an application form duly filled in and signed by his/her parents/guardians.
- 3) All admissions shall be valid only for one academic year and students are required to take admission in the prescribed form for every subsequent year.
- 4) A student once admitted will be continued as duly admitted for the academic year unless he/she informs the Principal in writing of his intention to leave the College, at least a week before the commencement of the Second Term.
- 5) Students who desire to change their subject can do it within ten days from the commencement of the College with a written permission of the Principal.
- 7) Repeaters are not eligible for admission to the same class.
- 8) All students have to abide by Mumbai University's ordinances regarding regular attendance and satisfactory academic progress. Minimum 75 % attendance for each term separately is necessary in order to be eligible for getting the terms granted.
- 9) Eligibility-Cum-Enrolment of students from another University shall not be admitted to any Institution maintained by or affiliated to the University of Mumbai except on production of a provisional statement of eligibility issued by the Registrar.
- 10) PG Registration is compulsory for MA & M.Com. students to confirm admission in College

- c. If he/she passes Semester-III and IV in full and secured ATKT in First Year by failing in not more than FOUR courses of Semester-I and Semester-III taken together with not more than TWO courses at each of Semester-III and Semester-IV.
- A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-VI irrespective of number of courses of failure in the Semester V.
- e. The learner can appear for the Semester-VI examination (subject to 9<sup>th</sup>) above but the result of Semester-VI shell be kept in abeyance Until the learner passes each of Semester I, II, III, IV and Semester V.

- i) A learner shall be allowed for Semester III (S.Y.)
  - a. If he/she passes each of Semester I and Semester II in full

- C) Original Marks-sheet of H.S.C. Examination alongwith two xerox copies of the same for the First Year.
- D) Leaving Certificate of Std. XII and its xerox copy.
- E) Full fees in cash, as prescribed in the fee structure in the Prospectus.
- F) Attested copies of marks statements of F.Y./S.Y. classes for the admission to S.Y. and T.Y. classes.

All Admissions will be treated as provisional until the Enrollment Certificate, final Eligibility Certificate and Transference Certificate are submitted to the College Office.

Students seeking for the concessions granted to the Economically Backward classes (EBC. ie. Whose annual income from all sources is less than Rs. 2,00,000/-) must furnish the following documents and information alongwith the application form for admission.

- 12. The College is not responsible for the loss of articles valuables of the students. The students should deposit lost / found articles, if found, in the College Office.
