RULES & REGULATIONS FOR ADMISSION

- 1) The right of admission to any class is reserved by the Principal of the College.
- 2) A student seeking admission to this College shall present himself / herself alongwith his / her parents / guardians with an application form duly filled in and signed by his/ her parents/guardians.
- 3) All admissions shall be valid only for one academic year and students are required to take admission in the prescribed form for every subsequent year.
- 4) A student once admitted will be continued as duly admitted for the academic year unless he/she informs the Principal in writing of his intention to leave the College, at least a week before the commencement of the Second Term.
- 5) Students who desire to change their subject can do it within ten days from the commencement of the College with a written permission of the Principal.
- 7) Repeaters are not eligible for admission to the same class.
- 8) All students have to abide by Mumbai University's ordinances regarding regular attendance and satisfactory academic progress. **Minimum 75 % attendance for each term separately is necessary in order to be eligible for getting the terms granted.**
- 9) Eligibility-Cum-Enrolment of the students from another University of Mumbai shall not be admitted to any Institution maintained by or affiliated to the University of Mumbai except on production of a provisional statement of eligibility issued by the Registrar.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Admissions for the F.Y. Classes will start immediately after the declaration of the results of the H.S.C. (XII) examination, as per the norms & procedure as decided by the University of Mumbai and Govt. of Maharashtra.

Admissions for the S.Y./T.Y. classes will start immediately after the declaration of the F.Y./S.Y. results or as per the notice given to the students.

Following are the rules of University of Mumbai for admission

Amended R. 8438

Eligibility for Admission to all the Under Graduate Programs (aided and un-aided) in the Faculties of Arts and Commerce under credit Based Semester and Grading System.

- a. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester II irrespective of number of courses of failure in the Semester-I
- b. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-III if he/she passes each of Semester-I and Semester-II

(OR)

A learner fails in not more than FOUR courses of Semester I and Semester II taken together with not more than TWO courses at each of Semester-I & Semester-II

- c. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-IV irrespective of number of courses of failure in Semester-III
- d. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-V
 - a. If he/she passes Semester, I, II, III and IV in full.

(OR)

- b. If he/she passes Semester-I and II in full and Secured ATKT in Second year by failing in not more than FOUR courses of Semester-III and Semester-IV taken together with not more than TWO courses at each of Semester-III and Semester-IV

(OR)

- c. If he/she passes Semester-III and IV in full and secured ATKT in First Year by failing in not more than FOUR courses of Semester-I and Semester-II taken together with not more than TWO courses at each of Semester-I and Semester-II.
- d. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-VI irrespective of number of courses of failure in the Semester V.
- e. The learner can appear for the Semester-VI examination but the result of Semester-VI shall be kept in abeyance until the learner passes each of Semester I, II, III, IV and Semester V.

While seeking admission in the College a student should submit the following duly completed documents.

- A) Admission Form along with a Passport Size Photograph.
- B) Enrolment Form with provisional Eligibility Certificate for Sr. College.
(For F.Y. Students)
- C) Original Marks-sheet of H.S.C. Examination alongwith two zerox copies of the same for the First Year.
- D) Leaving Certificate of Std. XII and its Zerox copy.
- E) Full fees in cash, as prescribed in the fee structure in the Prospectus.
- F) Attested copies of marks statements of F.Y./S.Y. classes for the admission to S.Y. and T.Y. classes.

All Admissions will be treated as provisional until the Enrolment Certificate, final Eligibility Certificate and Transference Certificate are submitted to the College Office.

Students seeking for the concessions granted to the Economically Backward classes (EBC. ie. Whose annual income from all sources is less than Rs. 2,00,000/-) must furnish the following documents and information alongwith the application form for admission.

- A) Income Certificate of the Parents (or Guardians, only if father is not alive) duly signed by Tahasildar.
- b) Student seeking Fee concession granted to the wards of C.T.E.S. Employees, must submit the Parent's Employment Certificate issued by C.T.E.S.

At the time of admission it is necessary to produce the following documents.

- i) Eligibility Certificate in case of students passing an examination of any University/Board other than the University of Mumbai.
- ii) Students from other Colleges affiliated to the University of Mumbai or other University / Boards, seeking admission in this College should produce a "NO OBJECTION CERTIFICATE" from the Principal of the College last attended.
- iii) Transference Certificate is to be produced by the student coming from other Colleges affiliated to the University of Mumbai.
- iv) Late Fee of Rs. 150/- per application will be charged for the application received for enrolment between the period from 1st Sept. to 30 th September every year. (O.114-A)
- v) Late fee Rs. 200/- per application will be charged for the applications received for enrolment between 1 st October to 31st December every year. (O-114-A) (With Special Permission of the Vice Chancellor.)

- i)** : Prior to commencement of academic term and instruction of the course
Deduction Charge : Rs. 500/- Lump sum
- ii)** : Upto 20 days after the commencement of academic term of the course.
Deduction Charge : 20% of the total amount of fees
- iii)** : From 21st day upto 50 days after commencement of the academic term of the course.
Deduction Charge : 30% of the total amount of fees
- iv)** : From 51st day upto 80 days after commencement of the academic term of the course August 31st whichever is earlier.
Deduction Charge : 50% of the total amount of fees
- v)** : From September 1st to September 30th
Deduction Charge : 60% of the total amount of fees
- vi)** : After September 30th
Deduction Charge : 100% of the total amount of fees

Note : The total amount considered for the refund of fees the commencement of academic term of the course includes the following.

- 1) All the fee items chargabel for one year are as per relevant University cirulars for different faculties (excluding the courses for which the total amont is fixed by other competent authorities)

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **Identity Card** : Students must carry their Identity Card with them and must present the same for inspection whenever demanded by any staff of the College. They will not be allowed to attend the classes, enter the library and participate in the extra-curricular activities without identity cards.
2. A student must be present for all the Lectures, Tutorials, Seminars and Examinations according to the Time Table.
3. Conduct of students in the classroom as well as in the College Premises should be such as causing no disturbance to the fellow students or to other classes.
4. Students applying for any Certificate, Testimonial and those who require the Principal's signature on any sort of documents should first contact the College office and apply in writing.
5. A Student / Parent / Guardian willing to meet the Principal is requested to meet him/her between 11 a.m. to 1.30 p.m. on all working days.
6. Economic aids and facilities to the students are being sanctioned as per the rules & regulations of the Govt.
7. In case of illness a student must apply for leave with Doctor's Certificate during his absence for illness.
8. Student Should not damage the property of the College. Strict action will be taken against those who are found guilty of damaging the College Property.
9. Student must attend all, NCC, NSS, DLLE and other activities of the college.
10. **The examination forms will not be accepted, under any circumstance of those students, whose attendance will be less than 75 % of the days on which the lectures are delivered. They will not be allowed to appear for the examination.**
11. Unless the student appears the Terminal and Preliminary Examinations, he/she will not be allowed to submit the university Examination Form for T.Y.B.A./B.Com.
12. The College is not responsible for the loss of articles valuables of the students. The students should deposit lost / found articles, if found, in the College Office.

13. Students should participate in maximum competitions & programmes organised by the College.
14. Matters not covered by the existing rules will rest at the absolute discretion of the Principal.
15. The students having A.T.K.T. in F.Y. & S.Y. both the years will not be eligible for getting admission in T.Y.B.A. / T.Y.B.Com. Class.
16. A candidate seeking admission in the college if found involved in ragging will not be given admission to any class. Similarly after admission the student is found involved in ragging his/her admission will be cancelled by the College.

Credit Based Semester & Grading System

A) Credit Based semester & Grading system has introduced by University of Mumbai with effect from the Academic Year 2013-14

• **EXAMINATION PATTERN :**

- 1) F.Y.B.A./ B.Com. : Ist sem. exam. & IInd sem. exam. 100 marks each
S.Y.B.A./ B.Com. : IIIrd sem. exam. & IVth sem. exam. 100 marks each
- 2) T.Y.B.A./ B.Com. : Vth sem. exam. & VIth sem. exam. 100 marks each

Each semester exam. is for 100 divided into :-

• **PASSING STANDARD** :- Minimum 40% marks are required to qualify exam. in each semester.

• **A.T.K.T.** : Students are allowed to keep term in II, IV & VI semester, irrespective of heads of failure in I, III and V semester respectively.

However, students are allowed to keep term in second year (Sem. III) only if he/she fails in not more than two heads in I sem. & II sem. Each.

Students are allowed to keep term in Third year (Sem. V) only if he/she passes in I & II sem. and fails in not more than two heads in III & IV sem. each OR if he/she passes III & IV sem. In full & fails in not more than two heads in I & II sem. Each.

- **ADDITIONAL EXAM.** :- Additional Examination for Semester I and Semester II be held after the conduct of Semester-II Examination in March/April every year and Additional examination for Semester-III and Semester IV be held after the conduct of Semester IV Examination in March/April every year. However, Additional Examination for Semester II and Semester IV be held after 20 days and before 40 days from the date of declaration of result of the respective Semester End Examination.
- **GRADING** : Students are awarded with grades in each semester exam. As below.

- **NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME**

The N.S.S. activity as initiated by the Ministry of Education to inculcate the spirit of social service in the young boys and girls has been introduced in this College from 1987. It provides ample opportunities to boys and girls to participate in the emancipation of the poor and needy sections of the Society. A high sense of dignity of labour is learnt when students take part in the rural construction work or lay up a road as a part of the programme started by the N.S.S. The annual camp is also conducted for the students in near by areas. Our College has been awarded best N.S.S. unit among all college of University in 2003-04
 - **NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC) Boys & Girls Unit.**

National Cadet Corps has been initiated by the Defence Ministry of India. Unity and Discipline is the motto of N.C.C. Its aims at training the students in a disciplined manner. This College has started NCC unit in June 1993. To build a second line of defence. Full Military Training is given to students through NCC. It grooms young boys and girls to become brave officers in defence forces.

Government of India has sponsored a golden opportunity for the NCC cadets by making the provision of 20 % seats reserved for the NCC cadets in each course of NATIONAL DEFENCE ACADEMY and INDIAN MILITARY ACADEMY. Many such other facilities are extended to the NCC cadets.

- **DLLE**

Students have to pay Rs. 36/- as Premium for Group Insurance at the time of admission.

SCHOLARSHIPS

- 1) Students belonging to the Economically Backward community or whose annual income is below **Rs. 6,00,000/-** are given concession in tuition Fees by the Government.
- 2) Students securing more than 60% marks in H.S.C. Exam. are eligible to apply for Govt. Open merit Scholarship.
- 3) Scholarship is awarded to the students whose guardians' are the Freedom Fighters.
- 4) Concession in fees is given to the students whose parents are the Primary School Teachers.
- 5) The Government provides some facilities to the physically handicapped and blind students through the Social Welfare Department.
- 6) Scheme of Post Matric Scholarship for students belonging to the Minority communities.
- 7) N.C.C. SAHARA SCHOLARSHIP : A sum of Rs. 2000/- will be awarded to those NCC cadets who should have completed two years NCC training by securing more than 70% marks in second year B.A. / B.Com. examination (For SC/ST more than 60% marks)
- 8) N.C.C. CHIEF MINISTER SCHOLARSHIP : This award is given to the third year NCC Cadet who secures more than 60% marks in S.Y.B.A./S.Y.B.Com exam. and who has completed two years NCC training.
