RULES & REGULATIONS FOR ADMISSION

- 1) The right of admission to any class is reserved by the Principal of the College.
- 2) A student seeking admission to this College shall present himself / herself alongwith his / her parents / guardians with an application form duly filled in and signed by his/ her parents/guardians.
- 3) All admissions shall be valid only for one academic year and students are required to take admission in the prescribed form for every subsequent year.
- 4) A student once admitted will be continued as duly admitted for the academic year unless he/she informs the Principal in writing of his intention to leave the College, at least a week before the commencement of the Second Term.
- 5) Students who desire to change their subject can do it within ten days from the commencement of the College with a written permission of the Principal.
- 7) Repeaters are not eligible for admission to the same class.
- 8) All students have to abide by Mumbai University's ordinances regarding regular attendance and satisfactory academic progress. **Minimum 75 % attendance for each term separately is necessary in order to be eligible for getting the terms granted.**
- 9) Eligibility-Cum-Enrolment of students from another University shall not be admitted to any Institution maintained by or affiliated to the University of Mumbai except on production of a provisional statement of eligibility issued by the Registrar.
- 10) PG Registration is compulsory for MA & M.Com. students to confirm admission in College

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Admissions for the F.Y. Classes will start immediately after the declaration of the results of the H.S.C. (XII) examination, as per the norms procedure as decided by the University of Mumbai & Govt. of India.

Admissions for the S.Y./T.Y. classes will start immediately after the declaration of the F.Y./S.Y. results or as per the notice given to the students by **following rules of University of Mumbai**

Eligibility for Admission

Eligibility for Admission to the Under Graduate Programs (S.Y./T.Y.) BMS

- a. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester II irrespective of number of courses of failure in the Semester-I
- b. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-III is he/she passes each of Semester-I and Semester-II

(OR)

A learner fails in not more than FOUR courses of Semester I and Semester II taken together with not more than TWO courses at each of Semester-I & Semester-II

- c. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-IV irrespective of number of courses of failure in Semester-III
- d. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-V
 - a. If he/she passes Semester I, II, III and IV in full.

(OR)

- b. If he/she passes Semester-I and II in full and Secured ATKT in Second year by failing in not more than FOUR courses of Semester-III and Semester-IV taken together with not more than TWO courses at each of Semester-III and Semester-IV

(OR)

- c. If he/she passes Semester-III and IV in full and secured ATKT in First Year by failing in not more than FOUR courses of Semester-I and Semester-II taken together with not more than TWO courses at each of Semester-III and Semester-IV.
- d. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-VI irrespective of number of courses of failure in the Semester V.
- e. The learner can appear for the Semester-VI examination (subject to 9th) above but the result of Semester-VI shall be kept in abeyance Until the learner passes each of Semester I, II, III, IV and Semester V.

Eligibility for admission to the Under Graduate Programs (S.Y. / T.Y.) Science / Information Technology

- i) A learner shall be allowed for Semester III (S.Y.)
 - a. If he/she passes each of Semester I and Semester II in full
 - b. He/she fails in not more than THREE COURSES, in each Semester I and II
 - c. He/She fails in not more than THREE COURSES with not more than total 200 marks for B.Sc.IT & 300 marks for B.Sc.in each of Semester I & Semester II.
- ii) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester V (T.Y.)
 - a. If he/she passes, Semester I, II, III and IV in full
 - b. He/she has passes Semester I and II in full and fails in not more than more courses in each of Semester III and IV.

[OR]

Learner shall have passed Semester III and Semester IV in full and Secured ATKT in First Year by failing in, not more than Three Courses in each of Semester I and II

- c. He/she has passes Semester I and III in full fails in not more than three course with not more than total 200 marks, in each of Semester III and IV

[OR]

Learner shall have passed Semester II and Semester IV in full and secured ATKT in First Year by failing in not more than Three courses with not more than total 200 marks, in each of Semester I and II

- iii) The learner can appear for the Semester VI examination but the result of Semester VI shall be kept in abeyance until the learner passes each of Semester I, II, III, IV and Semester V in full.

While seeking admission in the College a student should submit the following duly completed documents.

- A) Admission Form along with a Passport Size Photograph.
- B) Enrollment Form with provisional Eligibility Certificate for Sr. College.
(For F.Y. Students)
- C) Original Marks-sheet of H.S.C. Examination alongwith two xerox copies of the same for the First Year.
- D) Leaving Certificate of Std. XII and its xerox copy.
- E) Full fees in cash, as prescribed in the fee structure in the Prospectus.
- F) Attested copies of marks statements of F.Y./S.Y. classes for the admission to S.Y. and T.Y. classes.

All Admissions will be treated as provisional until the Enrollment Certificate, final Eligibility Certificate and Transference Certificate are submitted to the College Office.

Students seeking for the concessions granted to the Economically Backward classes (EBC. ie. Whose annual income from all sources is less than Rs. 2,00,000/-) must furnish the following documents and information alongwith the application form for admission.

- A) Income Certificate of the Parents (or Guardians, only if father is not alive) duly signed by Tahasildar.
- b) Student seeking Fee concession granted to the wards of C.T.E.S. Employees, must submit the Parent's Employment Certificate issued by C.T.E.S.

At the time of admission it is necessary to produce the following documents.

- i) Eligibility Certificate in case of students passing an examination of any University/Board other than the University of Mumbai.
- ii) Students from other Colleges affiliated to the University of Mumbai or other University / Boards, seeking admission in this College should produce a "NO OBJECTION CERTIFICATE" from the Principal of the College last attended.
- iii) Transfer Certificate is to be produced by the student coming from other Colleges affiliated to the University of Mumbai.
- iv) Late Fee of Rs. 150/- per application will be charged for the application received for enrolment between the period from 1st Sept. to 30 th September every year. (O.114-A)
- v) Late fee Rs. 200/- per application will be charged for the applications received for enrolment between 1 st October to 31st December every year. (O-114-A) (With Special Permission of the Vice Chancellor.)

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Every student must keep with him an **Identity Card** duly signed by the Student & the Principal.
2. A student must be present for all the Lectures, Tutorials, Seminars and Examinations according to the Time Table.
3. Conduct of students in the classroom as well as in the College Premises should be such as causing no disturbance to the fellow students or to other classes.
4. Students applying for any Certificate, Testimonial and those who require the Principal's signature on any sort of documents should first contact the College office and apply in writing.
5. A Student / Parent / Guardian willing to meet the Principal is requested to meet him/her between 11 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. on all working days.
6. Economic aids and facilities to the students are being sanctioned as per the rules & regulations of the Govt.
7. In case of illness a student must apply for leave with Doctor's Certificate during his absence for illness.
8. Student Should not damage the property of the College. Strict action will be taken against those who are found guilty of damaging the College Property.
9. Student must attend all, NCC, NSS, DLLE and other activities of the college.
10. **The examination forms will not be accepted, under any circumstance of those students, whose attendance will be less than 75 % of the days on which the lectures are delivered. They will not be allowed to appear for the examination.**
11. Unless the student appears the Terminal and Preliminary Examinations, he/she will not be allowed to submit the university Examination Form for T.Y.BMS / B.Sc.IT / B.Sc.
12. The College is not responsible for the loss of articles valuables of the students. The students should deposit lost / found articles, if found, in the College Office.
13. **Identity Card** : Students must carry their Identity Card with them and must present the same for inspection whenever demanded by any staff of the College. They will not be allowed to attend the classes, enter the library and participate in the extra-curricular activities without identity cards.
14. Students should participate in maximum competitions & programmes organised by the College.
15. Matters not covered by the existing rules will rest at the absolute discretion of the Principal.

16. A candidate seeking admission in the college if found involved in raging will not be given admission to any class. Similarly after admission the student is found involved in raging his/her admission will be cancelled by the College.
17. As per University of Mumbai circular No : UG/83/2009, those students fail to submit their registration form, will not be allowed to appear for examination.

- **PASSING STANDARD** :- Minimum 40% marks are required to qualify internal & theory exam. in each semester.
- **A.T.K.T.** : Students are allowed to keep term in II, IV & VI semester, irrespective of heads of failure in I, III and V semester respectively.
However, students are allowed to keep term in second year only if he/she fails in not more than two heads in I sem. & II sem. Each.
Students are allowed to keep term in Third year only if he/she passes in I & II sem. And fails in not more than heads in III & IV sem. Each OR if he/she passes III & IV sem. In full & fails in not more than two heads in I & II sem. Each.
- **GRADING** : Students are awarded with grades in each semester exam. As below.

At the end of Degree, evaluation, grades will be awarded to students on the basis of aggregate performance in all semester Exams.

- **EVALUATION OF PROJECT (For BMS / B.Sc. IT)**
 - a. A student who PASSES IN ALL THE THEORY PAPERS BUT DOES NOT secure minimum grade of E in project as applicable has to resubmit a fresh project till he/she secures a minimum of grade E. His/her marks in the theory papers that the student has passed will be carried forward but he/she shall be entitled for grade "E" on passing.
 - b. The evaluation of project and viva-voce examination shall be by awarding grade in the seven point scale as gives in (I) above.
 - c. A student shall have to obtain minimum of grade E (or its equivalent marks) in project evaluation and viva/voce taken together to obtain 40% marks in project work.

- 2) Students securing more than 60% marks in H.S.C. Exam. are eligible to apply for Govt. Open merit Scholarship.
- 3) Scholarship is awarded to the students whose guardians' are the Freedom Fighters.
- 4) Concession in fees is given to the students whose parents are the Primary School Teachers.
- 5) The Government provides some facilities to the physically handicapped and blind students through the Social Welfare Department.
- 6) Scheme of Post Matric Scholarship for students belonging to the Minority communities.
- 7) N.C.C. SAHARA SCHOLARSHIP : A sum of Rs. 2000/- will be awarded to those NCC cadets who should have completed two years NCC training by securing more than 70% marks in second year BMS/B.Sc.IT/B.Sc. examination (For SC/ST more than 60% marks)
- 8) N.C.C. CHIEF MINISTER SCHOLARSHIP : This scholarship given to the third year NCC Cadet who secures more than 60% marks in S.Y. BMS / B.Sc.IT / B.Sc. exam. and who has completed two years NCC training.
- 9) **As per direction of special District Social Officer, Palghar all the scholarship and freeship holder students should open their scholarship A/c. in the Nationalised Bank, at Dena Bank, Chinchani before 30st June 2020.**
